

## Booking Accessible Seats Online

For our seated events, some seats are held off from general sale - for instance spaces for wheelchair users, seats with flat floor access, and where applicable seats with best views of captioning or BSL interpretation.

If you need to book one of these seats, you can do so online by indicating your access requirements on your account – see instructions below.

Personal Assistant tickets for customers who would otherwise be unable to attend the venue are available free of charge.

PA tickets can be booked online by customers who have joined our [Access Register](#) and provided proof of eligibility. They can also be booked by [contacting the box office](#) directly.

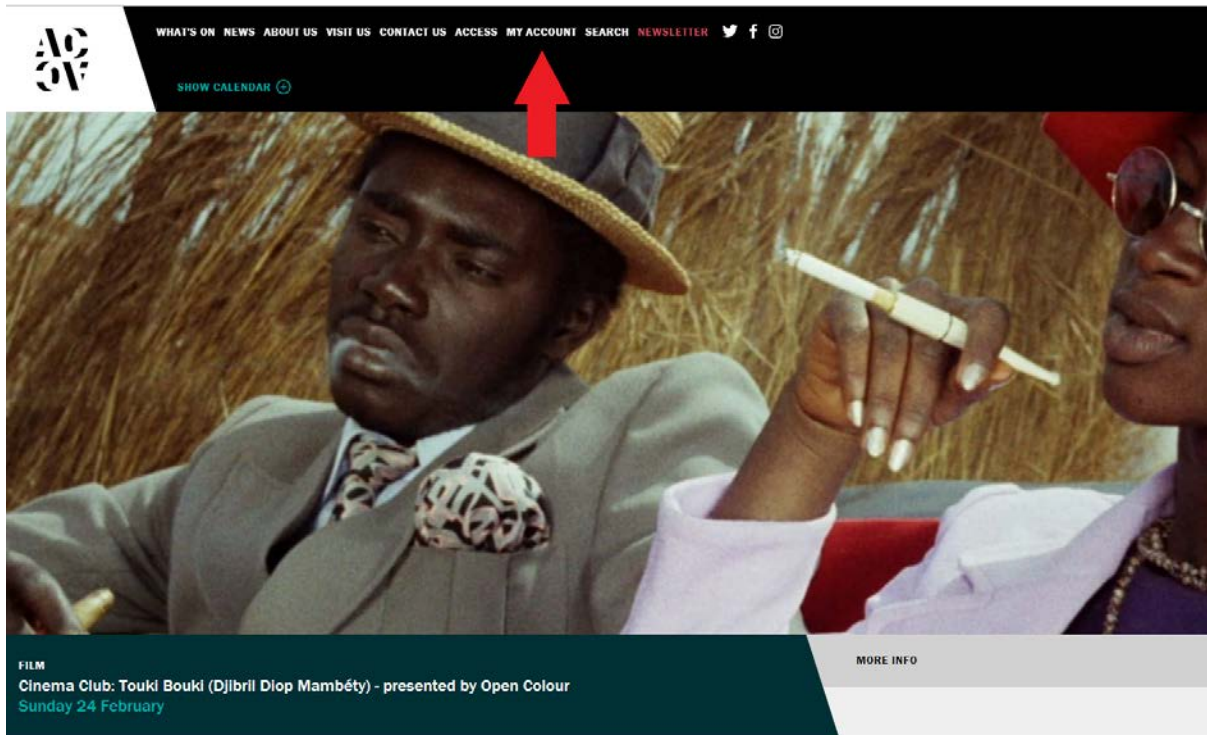

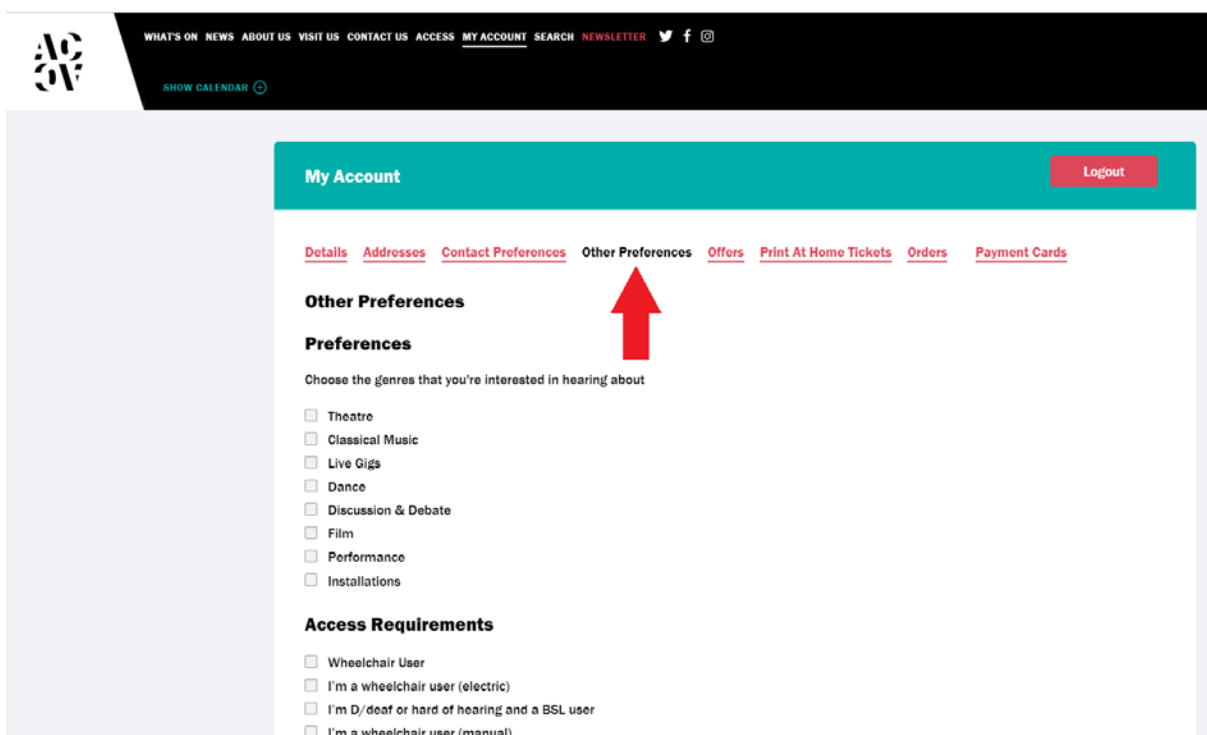

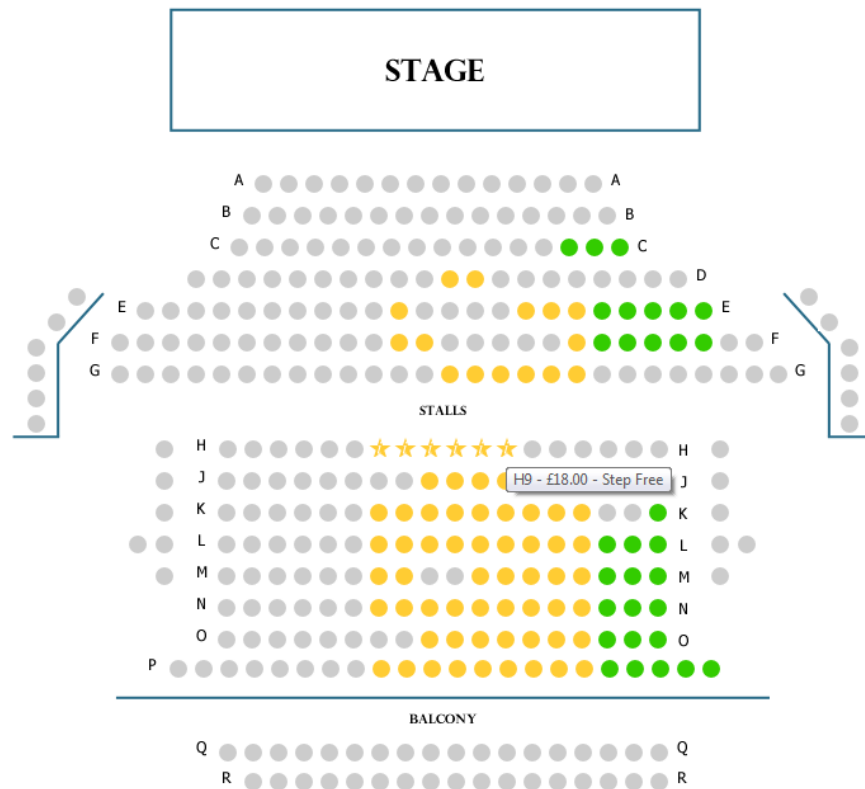

When going to book tickets, the seats with step free access are now available, and are marked with a star:



These seats can be selected and booked as normal.

## Auditorium

Further information about the seating in the auditorium:

There are three routes to the auditorium:

- Stairs from the foyer – 18 steps
- Stairs from the café – 16 steps
- Customer lift

Row H has step-free access; it is the central row in the auditorium, about halfway back from the stage.

The following seats can be booked as spaces for wheelchair users:

- H4, H7, H16, H19

Rows A – G are closer to the stage, and are down 1 – 7 stairs from Row H level.

Rows J – P are further away, and are up 1 – 7 stairs from Row H.

Rows Q and R are on the rear balcony, and are only accessible via stairs (16 steps from auditorium level).

The two small side balconies are accessible via stairs (10 steps from auditorium level).
